





Quality Healthcare

Spain has one of the best public health systems in the world, providing universal care to its citizens. Basic state services are free, but there are specialized services that patients need to pay for, such as orthopedic, ophthalmologist and dental services. Please be aware that appointments with specialist doctors may have a delay of several months.

You will also have access to the benefit of a co-payment system where residents usually just pay between 10% and 60% of the cost of prescription medication.

Dental Service in Spain

Some basic dental treatment is available under the state system, but oral health care service of the National Public Health System is very limited, so most people use private dental clinics.

The National Public Health System includes healthcare, diagnostic and therapeutic activities, as well as health promotions, health education and preventive services aimed at oral health care.

There are several discount programs exclusive to EPAMers, allowing you to access most treatments at a special price.



Education Opportunities



PRESCHOOL EDUCATION

Pre-school education is divided into two cycles of three school years each:

The first cycle of preschool education (3 months to 3 years) is taught in nursery schools and kindergartens and is normally structured in three homogeneous age groups. Kindergarten in the first cycle in Andalusia is not free. Andalusia Administration will subsidize part of the expenses depending on your last year's income. In general, the schedule varies depending on the community. The kindergarten calendar generally runs from September to July, closing in August.

The second cycle of preschool education (3 years to 6 years) is free. It is voluntary, so students can join this stage in any of the grades. In general, the second cycle of kindergarten is taught in the same school center as the primary education group. These centers may be public, subsidized or private. Most of the centers that offer the second cycle also offer primary education, and some of them offer Compulsory Secondary Education (ESO) and Baccalaureate.

The school year runs from September to June.

"We moved to Málaga when our son was two and our daughter almost six. To **fully integrate** with the Spanish system, we chose a public school and kindergarten. Classes there are taught in Spanish, but in such a way the kids get the material without speaking the language. They also study English from the first grade."

PRIMARY SCHOOL

When choosing the primary education center for your children, you must consider different aspects such as its ownership, the pedagogical project, location, size, studies offered, etc.

Primary education is a compulsory and free stage and covers from 6 to 12 years of age, organized in three cycles of two years each:

- Initial cycle: from 6 to 8 years old
- Middle cycle: from 8 to 10 years of age
- Upper cycle: from 10 to 12 years of age

The school calendar runs from September to June.

Family Life

Children get free public healthcare and education. Most public and concertado (semi-private) schools are bilingual. The bilingualism in public and private schools means greater immersion in the English language, but does not imply a 50% Spanish and 50% English bilingualism.

Málaga and Andalusia have plenty for kids to do: aquaparks, zoos, interactive museums, amusement parks and more!

Exploring the rest of Spain is easy, with quick access to public transportation in Málaga and the Costa del Sol. So go explore or hop back home to visit the family. Málaga international airport is 8 kms from the city center. The main A7 road runs all along the southern coast to link the popular Costa del Sol resorts, in Málaga, Marbella and Estepona, as well as providing links to major cities such as Cordoba, Sevilla, Madrid and Valencia. There is also a highly efficient, high-speed train network linking Málaga with other major cities such as Madrid, Sevilla and Barcelona.



Relocation Checklist

EPAM covers (family members included):

- Work permit and Visa associated costs (including logistics)
- Transfer to Spain (flight/train/bus tickets or car mileage coverage)
- Extra luggage (airplane) up to two suitcases per person
- · Six weeks of accommodation upon your arrival in Spain
- Public transport in Spain up to 100€ for the first month after relocation
- Residence permit extension (if needed)

EPAM doesn't cover:

- · Any expense related to travel documents or passport issuance or renewal
- Checked bags exceeding the limit of two checked bags per person or overweight/oversize luggage
- Pet travel arrangements
- Incidentals, laundry, room service, and long-distance calls in temporary housing at your destination
- · Fines or penalties incurred in the process of relocation
- Any costs related to the applicant's non-immediate family members or other significant others (parents, grandparents, in-laws, siblings, friends, etc.)

DRIVER'S LICENSE

You might need to exchange your driver's license or get a new one depending on the agreement between your home country and Spain.



SHIPPING YOUR VEHICLE

Bear in mind that if you decide to bring your vehicle to Spain, additional arrangements will be needed to legalize it in Spain (extra costs may be applicable).



EDUCATION

Bring your original diploma and your children's education certificates with you to facilitate the adaptation process.

Spanish Permanent Residence/Citizenship

After 5 years in Spain under temporary work and residence permits, an employee can apply for Spanish permanent residence, and this permit card must be renewed after 5 years. Citizenship can be requested after 10 years of residence permits in Spain.

Exemptions:

- Nationals from Spanish-American countries are eligible for citizenship after 2 years in Spain: Argentina, Bolivia, Brazil, Chile, Colombia, Costa Rica, Cuba, Ecuador, El Salvador, Honduras, Mexico, Nicaragua, Panama, Paraguay, Peru, Puerto Rico, Dominican Republic, Uruguay and Venezuela, Andorra, the Philippines, Equatorial Guinea, Portugal, and those of Sephardic origin.
- After 1 year, an employee is eligible for citizenship if married to a Spaniard, widowed from a Spaniard, or the child or grandchild.
- Refugees are eligible for citizenship in 5 years.

Applications for permanent residence/citizenships are not supported by the Company currently. This Policy may be reviewed in the future. However, the Company's involvement might be very limited in this process (via information support or financing) as it comes to the relationship between the individual and the State. The Company/Employer does not have any influence on this process.

There is a difference in permanent residence and citizenship permits. The first is an employment permit that allows a person to work and live in Spain if the employee can gather the documentation and comply with requirements to stay in Spain (employment, economical means, etc.). The second is national citizenship; this is the permanent bond the employee may create with the country of Spain (without any additional requirements for employment).



Spanish Language Courses

If you are going to immerse yourself in the Spanish language and culture, we greatly encourage you to do so. Spanish is one of the most spoken languages in the world.

The Spanish language is more and more common for foreigners to learn. In many countries, Spanish is the second foreign language taught in formal education, and in many companies and institutions, knowledge of Spanish is highly valued.

When you look up Spanish language courses, you can find a variety of private teachers, academies and certified schools that offer Spanish courses at all levels. EPAM Spain provides all its non-Spanish speaking team members with on-site Spanish lessons that will help you adapt to the country.

If you prefer an official institution, the Federation of Spanish schools contains a catalog where you can search for a school accredited by the Cervantes Institute by city. The Cervantes Institute is a public institution created in 1991 by Spain to universally promote the teaching of the Spanish language in the world.

In order certify your language proficiency within the Spanish State, you can also prepare for official certificates such as DELE and SIELE, qualifications that prove the degree of competence and command of the Spanish language.

Labor Market, Pension and Taxes

Labor Market Overview for Non-IT Market

From an employment standpoint, Spain's business structure is highly fragmented, consisting of small business units.

The largest percentage of small enterprises is in the services sector, especially in trade. In contrast, the bulk of large companies is concentrated in the industrial sector. Moreover, a significant number of large companies are major international players in sectors related to infrastructure development, renewable energy, tourism, banking, insurance, the textile industry, health technology, aeronautics, the agri-food sector and the car industry. Despite developments, Spain's labor market still has room for improvement, and the ability to communicate in Spanish, among other languages will significantly increase the opportunities of getting a job.

Pension Fund in Spain

The public retirement system in Spain has its own particularities for foreigners depending on the country of origin. Existing bilateral agreements must be considered, as well as the years of contributions and the minimum period of residence in Spain. However, social security for foreigners in Spain will always provide a series of minimum rights, regardless of the situation of the applicant. As a rule, to benefit from the minimum retirement system in Spain, the fundamental requirement is that you have contributed 15 years to Social Security (25 since 2027). To access the regular pension in Spain, you will have to have worked in Spain, contributing, for 37 years and 9 months with an age of 66 years and 4 months old (requirements will be adjusted by government in 2027). In addition, the period in which you did it is also important: at least two of those years worked must have been in the 15 years immediately prior to the application.

As an alternative, you will always have the possibility to adhere to a Private Pension Plan, which has fiscal advantages.



Taxes in Spain

EPAM Spain provides Professional Tax support to all the relocated team members at the beginning of their employment. A tax advisor will analyze your personal circumstances and advise you on the most suitable tax arrangement. They will also take care of the submission of the official paperwork for application.

All permanent full-time employees in Spain contribute 6.45% of their salary to social security (deducted through payroll).

Generally, the following rules apply to relocated employees: During the first 6 months (183 days) of employment in Spain, an employee is considered a non-tax resident. As a non-tax resident, your personal income tax will be fixed (24%).

In case you were a tax-resident in another EU country before arriving in Spain, you can opt to put down the fixed tax rate (19%) after providing the HR department with relevant official documentation.

After First 6 Months: Become Tax Resident in Spain

Once the 183 days have passed, you will become a tax resident in Spain. Personal income tax will not be fixed anymore and will be calculated considering two variables:

- Your personal situation (marital status, number of children, etc.)
- Your annual gross salary
